We are happy to introduce "Rag Bag" our new School Textile Recycling Scheme that will be rolling out across Scotland throughout 2006/2007.

The "Rag Bag" scheme has been developed to:

- Raise awareness about Textile Recycling in Scottish schools
- Raise School Funds
- Increase Textile Recycling rates, assisting Scottish Local Authorities to meet challenging Recycling Targets

Schools can benefit from 2-3 textile collections per year, raising valuable funds from unwanted textiles.

Money raised can help fund school trips, computer equipment, library books etc.

School Collections

Working in partnership with the Local Authorities, we invited Falkirk and Fife schools to register for the "Rag Bag" scheme earlier this year.

This prompted a fantastic response: 47% of Falkirk schools and 38% of Fife schools signed up for a collection.

One of our local schools in Denny, Head of Muir Primary School was the very first school to register for the scheme and a successful collection on Thursday 14th September 2006 raised £42 for their school funds.

The problem of single shoes typically starts at the point of donation into a Textile Bank and whilst we have always made every effort to pair shoes that have become separated, there was always a proportion of shoes destined never to find their partner.

We are continuing to site more dedicated Shoe Recyclers across Scotland encouraging the donation of paired shoes (with an elastic band or by tying laces together). Coupled with the continued help of charities who pair donated shoes with rubber bands, this has vastly reduced the number of single shoes hopping their way into the factory.


